<p style="text-align: center;"><i>Instructional Location: Bathroom or Classroom</i></p> <p>Rationale: Promote safety, respect other student's privacy and personal space, maintain clean environment</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Behaviors that should be used:</i></p> <p>Walk Keep body parts to yourself Use indoor voices Mind your business Keep area clean Be prompt</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><i>Teaching Plan:</i></p> <p>Presentation: By classroom, students will file into bathroom. Teacher will then announce expectations to the group. Volunteers will demonstrate correct ways to act safe and respectful in the bathroom. Some students will demonstrate unsafe behaviors. Students will rate the performances by giving thumbs up or down to indicate proper and improper behavior.</p>		
After the Lesson		
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily, for the first three weeks of school, teachers provide pre-corrections (reminders about what bathroom behaviors are acceptable). • Pair students to the bathroom (a good way for students to tell on other students) • When necessary, have adult supervision or provide structured bathroom break time. • Students are rewarded with class-wide sunny spot if there are no complaints about bathroom behavior each of the first three weeks
