 Greet your bus driver with "Good Morning!", "Good Afternoon!", or "Thank You!" Keep your personal space while riding the bus Keep the bus clean. Talk quietly. 	 Be on time to the bus stop. Stay in your seat. Keep track of your personal belongings. Put trash in the trash can before entering or exiting the bus. 	 Walk to and from your bus. Wait for the buses to completely stop before getting on or off of them. Keep your personal space. 	 Be prepared for your stop. Listen for your bus number.
Teaching Examples			

- 1. You are heading to the bus loading area and you see students ahead of you. You want to run, but you remember that walking is safer.
- 2. The bus drivers are not at the bus stop yet. You want to be the first in line, so you think about pushing through the group of smaller children. You stop and line up at the end of the line.
- 3. You start to run toward the bus, but an adult reminds you to stop and walk. You don't argue. Stop and slow down to a safe walking speed.
- 4. You get on the bus and sit down. Your friend gets on and sits in front of you. Stop before you move to a different seat, and ask your friend to sit with you the next day.

Student Activities:

- 1. Ask 2 or 3 students to demonstrate how to line up to get on the bus.
- 2. Have students show where and how they wait if they are waiting for a ride.
- 3. Ask 2 or 3 students to show how to wait your turn before getting on the bus.
- 4. Have several students explain the steps to get on the bus from their houses.
- 5. Have the students practice loading on the bus, finding a seat quickly, and staying in their seats.

After the Lesson

- 1. Just before the students leave for the bus, ask them to tell how they will be safe in the bus loading area.
- 2. When a student in unsafe in the bus loading area, tell then to stop and tell you how they could be safe.
- 3. When a students are being safe, give them specific praise.
