Teaching Examples

- (Show Respect)*
 - You are walking to get a drink in the classroom when you notice papers that had fallen on the floor. You stop and restack the papers and then continue to go get a drink.
 - You are getting into groups for science. You notice one of your classmates hasn't found a group. You walk over to him/her and ask them to be in your group.
 - You have a great story to tell your friend about the weekend, but realize your teacher is talking. When you get a break, you decide it is now appropriate to tell the story.
- (Show Responsibility)*
 - You arrive at school and go straight to your room. Once in the room you start playing catch with a ball you brought in for recess. You then remember that you should start your morning activity and quickly put the ball away.
 - You are assigned homework by your math teacher. You tell yourself that you will remember to do it and start to shove the paper in your desk. You stop and remember quickly get out your student planner and write down your homework and when it is due.
 - You are asked to get out your science book and read with a partner. You quietly find a partner and begin the task.
- (Show Safety)*
 - You start to run to the door to line up for lunch, but a friend stops to remind you to walk. You agree with your friend and walk to get in line together.
 - You are sitting in class and decide to lean back in your chair to get a better view at the board. You quickly put your chair back on all fours because you remember that it is unsafe and you could fall.

Student Activities

- Ask students to give examples of situations in the Classroom in which they can be responsible, respectful and safe.
- Class meetings
- Role plays created by students that show how to be responsible, respectful, and safe—also how not to.
