<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Be quiet and respectful of others in learning labs and classrooms • While traveling • Hands at sides • Walk in single file 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Walk facing the person in front of you • Go and return promptly to and from your destination • Remain in line with your class 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Always WALK! • Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself • Stay to your right in the hallways and stairs • On the stairs, take one step at a time
Student Activities		
<p>(Role Plays)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Model and practice how to line up in the classroom 2. Review expectations for the hallway. (Whole class/individual/small group) 3. Exit and proceed to destination using the shortest possible route. <p>Other examples: Present situations to students and discuss how they would handle each one.</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> a. What should I do if I encounter a friend in the hallway? b. What should I do if an adult greets me in the hallway? c. What should I do if others in my group want to take a “scenic” route? d. Etc. <p>Other Student Activities:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ask several students to show how they walk on the right side of the hall and stairs. Demonstrate the appropriate behavior. 2. Ask several students what would happen if someone jumped up and touched something. Have students demonstrate the appropriate behavior. 3. Ask several students to demonstrate how to safely pass or wait for other classes to pass in the hallway. 		
After the Lesson		
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before students walk down the hall for transition, ask them to tell you how they are going to walk to be responsible, respectful, and safe. 2. When you see students who are not demonstrating hallway expectations, ask them to stop and tell you how they can be respectful, responsible, and safe. 3. Whenever a student/students demonstrate(s) respectful, responsible, and safe behavior in the hallways provide verbal praise, sunny spots, etc. 4. Reinforce expectations frequently with oral review, role play, and teachable moment strategies.
