<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Speak kind words to one another. Be positive about learning. Keep your personal space. Raise your hand if you have a question, and wait to be called on. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Take care of your belongings (computers, art supplies, books, music equipment, Phys. Ed. equipment). Take responsibility for your actions. Accept consequences appropriately. Have all materials ready to begin class (sneakers, folders, books). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Stay in your seat or move safely and slowly throughout the room. Keep your hands, feet, and objects to yourself. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Follow directions the first time. Ask permission before leaving the room.
Teaching Examples			
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. (RESPECT): Speak kind words to one another. Be positive about learning. Keep your personal space. Raise your hand if you have a question, wait to be called on. 2. (RESPONSIBILITY): Take care of your belongings (art supplies). Take responsibility for your actions. Accept consequences appropriately. 3. (SAFETY): Stay in your seat, always sitting on the art room stools, or move safely and slowly throughout the room. Keep your hands, feet, and objects to yourself. 4. (DO YOUR JOB): Follow directions the first time. Ask permission before leaving the room. Be willing to pass out and collect art supplies if asked to. Clean up after yourself, helping others clean up when finished. 			
Student Activities			
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Ask students to give examples of situations in the art room in which they need to be safe, show respect, and show responsibility. 2. During class, have a group discussion with the class about doing your job and what that looks like. 3. Discuss expected behaviors in the art room with a yarn ball game done in the beginning of the year. 			
After the Lesson			
<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Before students go to the art room, ask them how they can be safe. 2. The art teacher and others will praise students for appropriate behaviors and give them a Falcon 5. 3. Before being excused, have students praise each other for appropriate and respectful art room behavior.
